New Film Exposes “Deadly Cargo” on British Roads

A film shedding new light on the danger and secrecy surrounding the transport of nuclear warheads on public roads throughout Britain will be launched on Saturday 29th March at the Glasgow Film Theatre.

Deadly Cargo, by award winning video activist collective Camcorder Guerillas uncovers how fully assembled Trident nuclear warheads are transported on public roads, in secret convoys, passing large centres of population. The film offers an insight into an issue usually well hidden from the public and explores how ordinary citizens in the NukeWatch network, track and campaign against the convoy and its deadly cargo – and how the viewer can help put an end to this nuclear madness.

Camcorder Guerillas said “We cover issues that the generally ignored by the mainstream media and this is one that everyone has ignored – til now”

“Nuclear weapons are generally perceived to be securely locked away in secretive military bases” added Adam Conway from NukeWatch. “In reality they are driven through our communities on public roads. The public has a right to know what is being transported on their streets and what the dangers are. We're hope this film will alert more people to these convoys and will ultimately lead to our communities rejecting these unsafe, illegal weapons from passing through them”

The launch will be at the Glasgow Film Theatre on Saturday 29th March at 12.30pm. Entry is free and DVD copies of the film will be on sale at the venue. Following the screening there will be an opportunity to put questions to some of the film-makers and members of the NukeWatch network.
