Thank you for the consultation in respect of the above.

Under the Town & Country Planning (General Development Procedure) Order 1995, as amended in 1997 local planning authorities have a duty to “consult the British Waterways Board before the grant of planning permission for development likely to affect specified inland waterways, reservoirs, canal feeder channels, watercourses, let offs and culverts”.

The proposal does not lie within the consultation zone (150m either side of the centre line) of any waterway, reservoir, canal, feeder channel, water course, let off or culvert owned or managed by British Waterways. British Waterways therefore has **no comments** to make.
