

- Reconstruction of fuel storage at Object 1152

## Ramenki

US intelligence reports indicate that a major underground facility was constructed in Ramenki. A photograph shows three mineheads in the area between Michurinskiy Prospect and Vernadskogo Prospect. In recent years there have been new building developments, including high-rise blocks, in parts of this area.

Unit 95006, a key part of GUSP SSO, is based at 80 Mosfilmovskaya Street. The presence of this unit was probably linked to the large underground complex nearby. The special garage of the Federal Protection Service (FSO) is on the other side of Mosfilmovskaya Street. This is the depot for cars used by senior figures in the Russian government. Mosfilmovskaya Street is being extended in a major road development, close to the FSO garage and the base of unit 95006.<sup>97</sup> In 2003 a 1.5 hectare site in Michurinsky Avenue was transferred from unit 95006 for a residential development.<sup>98</sup> Unit 95006 also has a warehouse 1.5 kilometres South-West of its main base.

Unit 57328 is associated with the construction of underground facilities. This unit had occupied part of Ramenki Street, but in 1998 the site was transferred from unit 57328. It is now a residential area.

## Significant military buildings

The Headquarters of the Naval General Staff, Object 1815, is at 6 Bolshoy Kozlovski Lane. The communications centre here is "Compass". The Russian Government were planning to move Naval Headquarters to Saint Petersburg. This now looks unlikely, but it may be moved to elsewhere in Moscow.

A Defence Ministry building on Bolshaya Pirogovskaya Street, 1.2 kilometres West of Frunzenskaya Embankment, was the Headquarters of the Russian Air Force until 1998. It is now the Logistical Headquarters of Armed Forces. It is likely that there was a bunker at this location and it may still be operational. There is a Reception and Retransmission Centre for the Monolith (257L) nuclear command system at the Communications Centre of the Logistical Headquarters of the Armed Forces, which is probably in this building.

41 Leningradski Prospect is a former Air Force building which became the military headquarters of the Warsaw Pact and then of the Commonwealth of Independent States. It has also housed support facilities including the computer centre for Armed Forces Logistics. A new exchange network has its hub in this building. This hub is linked to three subordinate exchanges at key sites - Chekhov-3, Episovo-10 and Serpurpukhov-13. 41 Leningradski Prospect also has a subordinate exchange which operates under the main 10,000 number exchange at Bolshoy Znameski Lane, along with other exchanges in Chekhov-3, Kolomna and Vatutinki.

The Logistics Headquarters for the Strategic Rocket Forces (SRF) are on Sadovoye Kol'tso. The communications systems here were refurbished in 2009 and a new network of fibre-optic links was created.

The military intelligence organisation, GRU, is based in Grizodubovoy Street.

## Kuznetsk-12

Unit 45108 of GUSP (SSO) is based at Kuznetsk-12 in Penza region. Unit 95006 is responsible for the school in the town. Kuznetsk-12 probably supports the General Staff Alternate Command Centre at Kuznetsk-8, which is 8 Kilometres South. Alternatively, it is possible that there could be an additional leadership bunker near Kuznetsk-12.

## Solhechnogorsk-30

The operational and technical management section (ETU) of GUSP <sup>is</sup> was tasked with "operational activity" for the Russian Government.<sup>100</sup> ETU Archive <sup>is</sup> was part of this section and <sup>is</sup> was based in the closed military town of Mirontsev, Solhenogorsk-30.<sup>101</sup> This is ~~now known~~ <sup>is</sup> as special military unit 68452. There is a checkpoint controlling access to the town. On the Southern edge of the base there is an 8 hectare high security area. The Southeastern corner of this secure area was redeveloped in 2004.<sup>102</sup>

## Holiday Cottages Odintsovo

Until 2010 Federal Institute Holiday Cottages Odintsovo was maintained by GUSP. <sup>It</sup> is a vacation complex 4 Kilometres North of the town of Odintsovo. It is only 3.3 kilometres from the old SRF bunker complex at Odintsovo-10. In 2009 GUSP asked for a detailed survey to be drawn up of the properties in the complex.<sup>103</sup> In 2011 this site appears to be operating as a commercial holiday retreat. So it may have been sold or leased out.

In the past, unit 95006 (GUSP) owned a residential tower block near the centre of the town of Odintsovo.
