The CSN insists on which he is " key " that supervises the starting of the reactor of the ' Tireless'

I. C., Madrid

The Council of Seguridad Nuclear (CSN), the independent organism that advises to the Government on the nuclear security, reiterated yesterday that he considered " key " to be able to supervise previous the hydrostatic tests to the starting of the reactor of the nuclear submarine British *Tireless* damaged in Gibraltar from May.

The CSN made these observations after the minister of Outer Subjects, Josep I itched, recognized Tuesday that had raised that request to the authorities of the United Kingdom but that there were no it, so far, accepted because of " security problems ". The engine room and the Control Panel are a secret area.

The weld of the cracked pipe will begin, in principle, the next Monday and would have to be finished at the beginning of February. Throughout that month other non-destructive testings of the system of refrigeration and, in March, the test of pressure would take place.

The ten militants of the ecological organization Greenpeace who were stopped Tuesday by the Gibraltarian police after approaching *the Tireless* were fined yesterday with 91,000 pesetas each one to enter military waters without authorization and to obstruct the work of police agents, according to informs **Innocent Romaguera** .

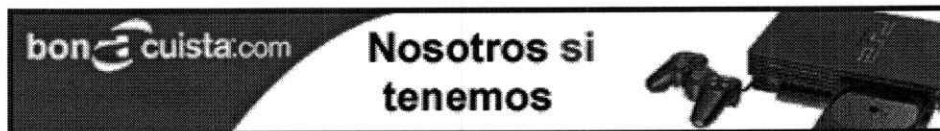
The Gibraltarian press was asked yesterday with preoccupation what had happened if instead of the action of protest of Greenpeace it had been a terrorist group armed the one that had assaulted the nuclear submersible.

An ecological group of Gibraltar, the Environmental Safety Group, will be united, for the first time, to a manifestation of protest in Spain, the one that has been summoned Saturday in Algeciras.
