

MoD denies deal over leaking submarine

MADRID

THE government insisted yesterday that it had not struck a secret deal to tow a nuclear-powered submarine back from Gibraltar if repairs were not finished on time.

HMS *Tireless* docked in the British colony on Spain's southern tip nine months ago after a crack was found in its cooling system.

The Spanish newspaper *El País* claimed that Britain had secretly agreed with Spain to tow the submarine back to Britain if its cooling system could not be repaired by May 19, the anniversary of the submarine's arrival in Gibraltar.

But a Ministry of Defence spokeswoman said repairs to the vessel should be finished at the end of March. She was not aware of any secret deal to tow the submarine back to Britain if repairs were not finished by May 19.

The MoD spokeswoman added: "Repairs to the submarine will start some time this week. If everything goes to time, repairs will be finished at the end of March."

She stated that safety was a paramount issue when deciding whether the vessel should leave.

In demonstrations just across the bay of Gibraltar, protesters, including politicians, union leaders and environmentalists, rallied behind a banner held aloft by

children that read: "For the sake of our future."

On Saturday, tens of thousands of people marched through the southern Spanish town of Algeciras calling for the *Tireless* to leave at once.

Police said 20,000 people attended the rally, but organisers put the number at 70,000.

The presence of the stricken submarine has provoked concern and anger among Spaniards living near Gibraltar and strained the already sour relations between London and Madrid over the colony.

Spain ceded Gibraltar in 1713 and now reclaims sovereignty but Britain refuses to discuss the issue.—AP
