Statement of Membership Philosophy

The Center for Strategic and International Studies established the Project on Nuclear Issues (PONI) in order to study, debate and assess the role of nuclear weapons in national security policy. Toward this end, PONI seeks to generate and sustain a networked community of young nuclear experts from the military, the national laboratories, industry, academia, and the policy community. Nuclear weapons are an enduring reality in the international security environment and in the security policy of the United States and other nuclear weapon states. PONI membership provides a forum for study and debate on the role that nuclear weapons have and might play in national security, to include strategies, policies and capabilities.

CSIS recognizes that some individuals and organizations advocate nuclear disarmament as a national security objective. We acknowledge the right of individuals and organizations to advocate these positions, but that is not the purpose of PONI. CSIS and PONI do not advocate any specific strategy, policy or program. But we base this community of analysts on the premise that nuclear weapons are an enduring reality and nations must manage this reality through an open and constructive debate.

PONI is an association of individuals, not institutions. PONI members have a right to engage in a free and open debate without intimidation. As such, members speak only on behalf of themselves, and are expected to respect the integrity of their colleagues. Participants are free to use the information they receive at PONI events, but may not cite either the identity or the affiliation of the speakers without their permission. Speakers own the exclusive rights to the content of their presentations. All PONI members collectively own the rights to the dialogue that ensues following the presentations, consistent with the attribution rules outlined above.

PONI membership is free. The program is underwritten by government and non-government organizations committed to sustaining a community of analysis. The underwriting sponsors exercise no direction on the intellectual content of the program. That direction is coordinated by CSIS, but is determined by the PONI members under the supervision of the CSIS PONI coordinators.
