GROTON, Conn. (AP) -- Two nuclear-powered submarines collided during training maneuvers off New York's Long Island. There were no injuries.

The Groton-based USS San Juan, a fast-attack sub, and the Kings Bay, Ga.-based USS Kentucky, A TRIDENT, [emphasis added] were both returning to Groton today under their own power for extensive checks.

Navy officials said after Thursday night's collision that there was only minor damage.

Lt. John Wallach said a senior officer will investigate.
