Ten sailors die on French nuclear sub

TEN sailors were killed by a leak of high pressure boiling steam aboard a French nuclear-propelled submarine in deep Mediterranean waters yesterday.

Rear Admiral Philippe Roy said a pipe broke on the submarine Emeraude and steam gushed out, killing all ten sailors carrying out a routine inspection of the turbine compartment. The submarine's captain was among the dead.

François Léotard, the de-fence minister, said the accident, 45 miles from the port of Toulon, caused no radioactive contamination.

The submarine made its way to Toulon. France is recalling three other nuclear submarines for checks. Reuter
