

On August 6th 1945, over 100,000 people were killed when an atom bomb was dropped on the Japanese city of Hiroshima. Just 3 days later another atom bomb was dropped on Nagasaki and another 75,000 people were killed. Even today people are still dying as a result of the radiation-linked diseases caused by those bombs.

Now nuclear weapons threaten the survival of the human race. Current nuclear weapon stockpiles in the world are equal to over 1 million of the bombs that destroyed Hiroshima and Nagasaki.

Another world war, using nuclear weapons, would be the last. Cities would be obliterated, the air, sea and land would be poisoned for generations and deadly radio-active fallout would make vast areas uninhabitable.

The Campaign for Nuclear Disarmament is part of a worldwide movement which opposes the nuclear threat in all its forms. We say that the wasteful and dangerous nuclear arms race should be stopped and that the money and resources thus saved should be used instead for the things we really need.
