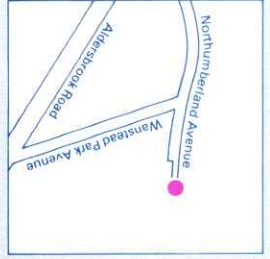


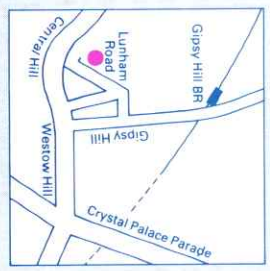

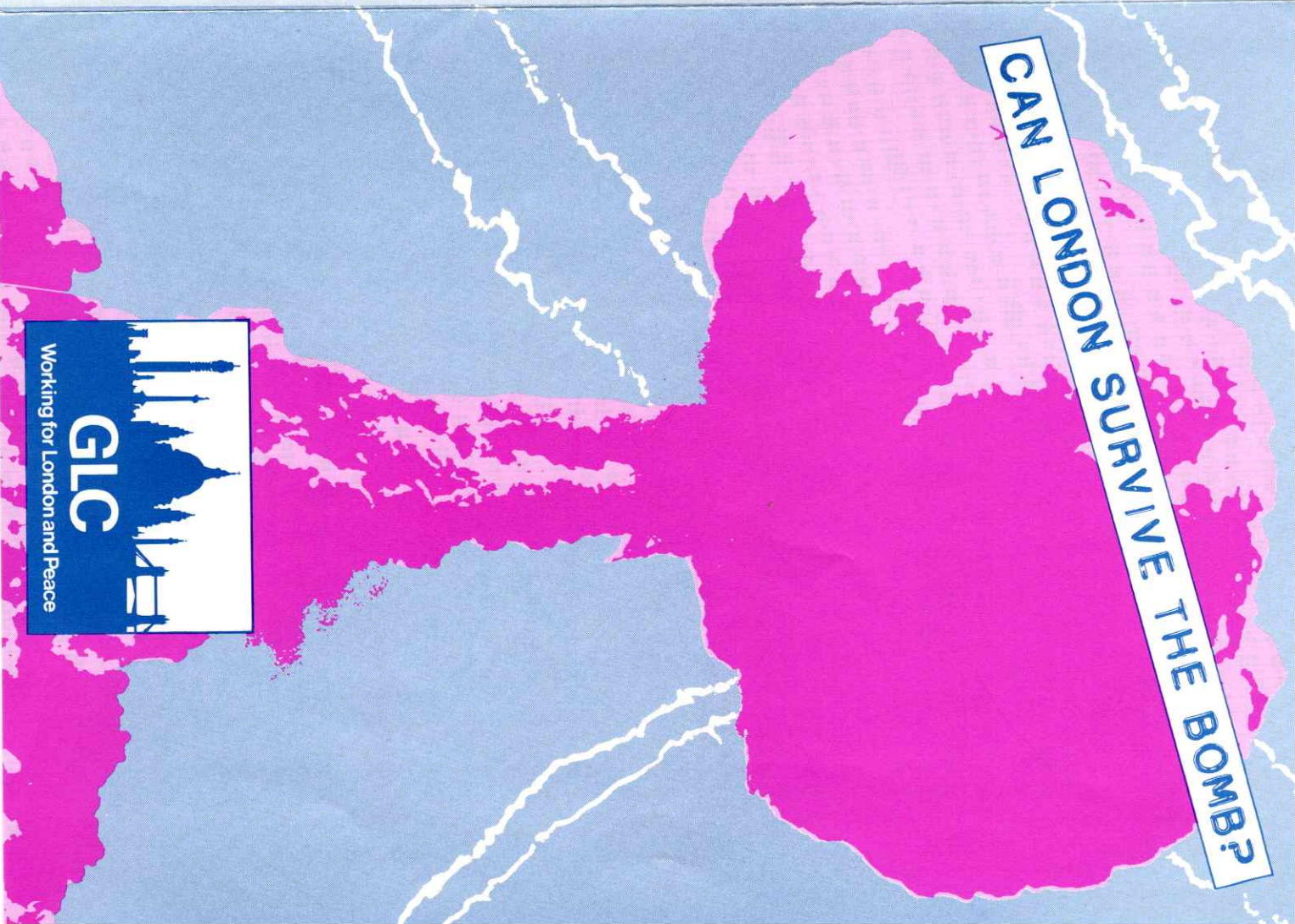

CAN LONDON SURVIVE THE BOMB?



WHAT WOULD HAPPEN TO LONDON IN A NUCLEAR ATTACK?

HOW MANY LONDONERS WOULD SURVIVE?

WOULD IT BE WORTH SURVIVING?

The Government requires the Greater London Council to make civil defence plans to cope with the aftermath of a hostile attack (including nuclear warfare).

But how realistic can these plans be?

Who will care for the sick and homeless or bury the dead? Will there be anybody left to put the plans into action? Or is it a hopeless waste of time?

The Government has postponed a national civil defence exercise 'Hard Rock' planned for the first week in October because the GLC and a large number of other local authorities refused to take part. The GLC wants all Londoners to have the chance to find out the facts for themselves.

OPEN DAYS

For the first time ever Londoners can visit their nearest GLC wartime control centre designed among other things to run London services after 'the bomb':

- at Church Hill Road, North Cheam, Surrey
 - at Northumberland Avenue, Wanstead, E12
 - at Pear Tree House, Lunham Road, West Norwood, SE19
- They will be open from Friday, 1 October to Wednesday, 6 October 1982 from 10am to 6pm, including Sunday.

EXHIBITIONS

In each centre the GLC is staging exhibitions which will show the background to Civil Defence, explain what the plans are intended to achieve and give the arguments about civil defence including material from Peace Groups. The exhibitions will also publicise scientific evidence on the effects of the bomb - some of it on public display for the first time.

The exhibition will also be at County Hall - 1 to 29 October, Monday to Friday, 9am to 6pm - to give every Londoner a chance to see it.

PUBLIC MEETINGS

The GLC is holding public meetings at each of the wartime control centres.

- Friday, 1 October, 7pm at Church Hill Road, North Cheam, Surrey.
- Saturday, 2 October, 2.30pm at Northumberland Avenue, Wanstead, London, E12
- Tuesday, 5 October, 7pm at Pear Tree House, Lunham Road, West Norwood, London, SE19.

This will:

Give you the opportunity to see a major film on what might happen if 'the bomb' bursts over London.

Give you the chance to hear expert speakers from the GLC Emergency Planning Division, Voluntary Scientific Advisers, and groups like the Campaign for Nuclear Disarmament and Scientists Against Nuclear Arms.

Give you the chance to have your say.
