A CHILLING sequel to the banned anti-nuclear film, The War Game, is to be made by the director responsible for the controversial original.

And a special fund-raising committee has been set up in the West of Scotland to raise cash towards the project.

Cash appeal for film sequel

They have set up the Peter Watkins Nuclear Film Appeal Fund in the hope of raising £25,000 locally.

Within weeks they have taken in £3000, the largest contribution coming from Renfrew District Council, which has agreed to hand over £1000.

The group has written to local authorities and other organisations throughout Scotland in a bid to raise funds.

The Labour-controlled Renfrew District Council is the first to give a cash pledge, although £2000 has already come in from private individuals. Appeal fund secretary, William Wolfe said today: "An extremely important

contribution to recruitment into the movement to prevent nuclear war was made by Peter Watkins's famous film The War Game.

"That he is now on the brink of making another powerful anti-nuclear film is very good news indeed for the peace and anti-nuclear movement.

"But to get started, the team needs money from people and organisations committed to nuclear disarmament.

Mr Watkins is on a world tour to launch his fund-raising campaign but will be travelling to Scotland in March to meet local organisers.
