38.6 million people would be killed by the initial effects of a nuclear attack on the UK.

That's the estimate of the British Medical Association's report on the effects of nuclear war.

Many more would die later as the effects of the weapons continued to take a toll on the body and on the environment.

The B.M.A. report warns that only ONE bomb exploded over a major city in the UK would produce enough casualties to overwhelm the entire country's medical services

The doctors' professional body is rarely so outspoken, but they're not alone in their concern.

Recent scientific studies have revealed that nuclear war would have a profound effect on the climate.

There would be near darkness and harsh winter conditions for several months in the Northern hemisphere.

The Nuclear Winter could be triggered by the use of less than 1% of the world's nuclear arsenal - and would affect the user's own country.

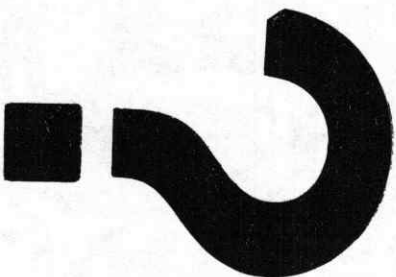

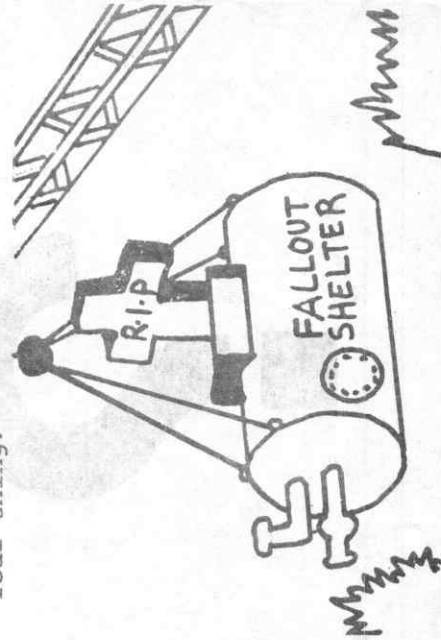


1 You are out in the countryside walking the dog when the nuclear alert sounds. It's an official civil defence exercise. Do you...

C. Have nothing to do with it - like many local authorities - because you know that expensive exercises only encourage people to believe that they can survive the real thing?

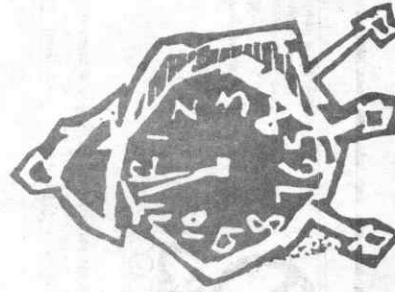


2 You are at home when a news flash tells you there's only a few minutes before a nuclear attack. (Fortunately your family are all in the house.) Do you...
